Our next blood drive is on June 26th, please consider giving the gift of life by donating a pint.


Let us all do something nice for someone anyone maybe a stranger, can you imagine what a better world this would be if we all could do a single act of kindness each day.







#### A PRAYER FOR OUR PRIESTS


