Sources and Makeup of Luke's Gospel

35% of Luke's Gospel comes from Mark: 20% comes from Q and 40% comes from L (material unique to Luke). Luke uses more of his own source (L) than Matthew uses of his own source (M). This makes sense when you consider that Luke had completed, "investigating everything accurately anew (1:3);" he must have uncovered more

previously unknown information than the other synoptic Gospels.

Luke had many talents. He was a Greek-speaking Gentile who was a God-fearing man, and was attracted to Judaism. According to St Jerome, he came from Antioch. Another source, the Anti-Marcionite Prologue, Luke was never married and died in Achaea at the age of 84. Mainly a physician, he was also an artist (a painter). He had talents as an eloquent writer and an excellent researcher. It is also said that Luke carved a statue of the Madonna with Child that also bears the name Our Lady of Guadalupe, but resides in a shrine in Extremadura, Spain (Most Rev Sean O'Malley. A Handbook of Guadalupe. Waite Park, MN: Park Press, Inc. 1997, p24-26)

Luke wrote his gospel in Achaea (according to later tradition). But St Jerome claims it was written in northwest Attica in Greece. Some speculate that Luke could have written his Gospel with the intentions of blaming the Jews for the crucifixion. Others argue that he was trying to persuade the Roman officials to treat the Christians more fairly. However, the most plausible purpose suggested is that Luke wanted to help the Christian audience with their own selfunderstanding.

Luke's Gospel and Acts of the Apostles are actually one two-volume book that were separated by the developers of the Canon. Each is opened with a comment directed to "Theophilus" (who is either the person who commissioned Luke to write these books or the community of believers for whom he is serving). Each contains the Ascension of Jesus; the Gospel ends with it and the Acts of the Apostles begins with it. Luke's Gospel also mentions the Holy Spirit 18 times, compared to 57 times in Acts (which is known as "The Gospel of the Holy Spirit").
