

Jesus in the temple. As it was written in Jewish law, every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord - in effect, given to God (Luke 2:23). The parents then had the opportunity to *buy back* the child by offering the trade of whatever animals they could afford. In the gospel, Joseph and Mary were poor and paid the price of "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons" (Luke 2:24). This drew up memories for Fr Gus:

"When I was born, I was the first child of my father and mother (they married a little late in life). When I was born, I was taken to the

Shrine of St. Anthony and offered to God. They shaved off my head like St Anthony's crown; the top was shaved and only a band around the side was left. Every time I was taken to the barber, the barber was told to keep the crown of St. Anthony on my head at all times. When I went to school,

the boys used to make fun of me; calling me 'St. Anthony.'

"At the age of nine, my mother died and my father was distraught. I was supposed to have the crown until I was 13 years old, but since my mother died, my father decided to do the ceremony of offering me to God and at the age of 10, he took me back to the same Shrine OF St. Anthony. I was told to take a dip in the sea and when I came out my head was completely shaved. Then I was auctioned off near the flagmasts where people gathered in front of the church. When the father bids the amount prescribed, no one can bid any higher. So, when my father reached that amount, he paid the money to the church to the church and got me back. And that was how I was offered to God and my father got me back."






