The resurrection of Christ offers all Christians hope. The joy of Easter is that Christ promised that he was going to suffer, die



and on the third day rise from the grave. Indeed, all these came to pass. At the time of Jesus and even before his time, there had been many people who claimed to be super powerful and promised their followers so many things including rising up from their dead graves. Centuries passed and no news was ever heard from them again.

Among the Ashantis in Ghana, there came into the scene a man called "Okomfo Anokye". He was seen to be a man of extraordinary powers. Anokye was the first traditional priest of the Ashanti Empire and Anokye was born in Ghana around 1655 and lived for 62 years.

History has it that when Okomfo Anokye was born he was already holding in his right hand a short white tail of a cow and he had to firmly clench the fist of the other hand that no one could open it. Anokye was



Our Next meeting will be Monday April 3rd 2023 at 7:00pm -Looking forward to seeing everyone.







One day, Anokye told the people that he was going to secure the key that will bring to an end, death. The people believed Anokye based on his usual performance of super powers. However, for many centuries now, Anokye has not returned from his journey to secure the key that will end death. Interestingly, the history of Anokye raises so much interest among the people in Ghana partly because of who he was. Just like Anokye, there have been many personalities who promised to defeat death but died without coming back to life.
