Chaplain's Message

This month's column is by Fr. George Oppong-Afriyie

Peace, the Priceless Gift offered to Humankind

In the beginning of creation, human development sought to establish agreements and pacts which would avoid the arbitrary use of force and enable them to seek a peaceful solution of any controversaries which might arise.

Alongside the legal systems of the individual peoples, there progressively grew up another set of norms which came to be known as *ius gentium* (the law of the nations). With the passage of time, this body of law gradually expanded and was refined in the light of the historical experiences of the different peoples. This process was greatly accelerated with the birth of modern states. From the sixteenth century on, jurists, philosophers and theologians were engaged in developing the various headings of international law and grounding it in the fundamental postulates of the natural law.

In reference to history, my dear friends in Christ, we have learned that the building of peace cannot prescind from respect for an ethical and judicial order, in accordance with the known adage: "Preserve order and order will preserve you". Precisely for this reason, in the message of salvation which the Church proclaims throughout the world, there are doctrinal elements of fundamental


importance for the development of principles needed for peaceful co-existence between peoples.


