The Body of Christ (Eucharist), is more than gold, silver, diamond or anything. But how much reverence do we pay to Jesus? As priests, deacons, Eucharistic ministers and the entire lay faithful, our priority should be that the Body of Christ we handle is the real Jesus, and that it is an undeserving privilege that has been offered to us to carry the Body of Christ, either to consume it ourselves or when we are taking it to the infirm.

We should, in faith, rise above the challenge of doubting the real presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist and offer it with the needed reverence. We however, as Catholics, believe what we celebrate and celebrate what we believe.

It is the responsibility of every bearer of the Body of Christ to recognize what he/she carries to the sick and to help the sick or homebound understand the efficacy of the Body of Christ, and what Christ can do in the lives of every believer!

An important component of every religious is the reverence that is part of the object of worship. In many religions, one cannot enter the Holy of Holies without removing his/her sandals. We Catholics are called to show reverence and respect whenever we are before the Blessed Sacrament or carrying it to those who are homebound.

As we carry the Body of Christ around, we should be mindful of our environment, that is, the manner in which we keep the pix. How clean and decent it is, do we keep the Body of Chris in the pix inside our pockets, purses or where? We become a sacred people anytime we carry the Body of Christ with us.


May we value the honor done us, and always observe the greatest reverence we ought to give the Body of Christ for the sick.
