The people of faith,

Each day, the Church begins the Liturgy of Hours with which we always pray together: "Come, let us sing joyfully to the Lord!". In that call, ringing down the centuries and echoing across the face of the globe, the psalmist summons the people of God to sing the praises of the Lord and to bear great witness to the marvelous things God has done for us. Priests, women and men Religious, and increasing numbers of lay people daily recite the Liturgy of the Hours, giving rise to a powerful mobilization of praise of God.

In the Gospel of Luke chapter 17:5, the apostles ask Jesus: "Increase our faith". This must be our constant prayer. Faith is always demanding, because faith leads us beyond ourselves. It leads us directly to God. Faith also imparts a vision of life's purpose and stimulus us to action. education carried out in countless families, schools and universities and all the healing and consolation imparted in hospitals and hospices and shelters. We must give thanks for the practical living out of God's call-in devoted services to others, in commitment to social justice, a responsible involvement in political life, in a wide variety of charitable and social organizations, and in growth of ecumenical interreligious understanding and cooperation.

Today though, some Catholics are tempted to discouragement or disillusionment, like the prophet Habakkuk in the First Reading. They are tempted to cry out to the Lord in a different way: why does God not intervene when violence threatens his people; why does God let us ruin and misery; why does God permit evil? Like the prophet Habakkuk, and like the thirsty Israelites in the desert at Meribah and Massah, our trust can falter; we can lose patience with God. In the drama of history, we can find our dependence upon God burdensome rather than liberating. We too can "harden our hearts".

And yet the prophet gives us an answer to our impatience: "If God delays, wait for him; he will surely come, he will not be late" (Cf. Hb. 2:3). Our God takes his times, but he is just". Every moment is our opportunity to model ourselves on Jesus Christ-to allow the power of the Gospel to transform our personal lives and our services to others, according to the spirit of the Beatitudes. "Bear your share of the hardship which the Gospel entails". Paul writes to Timothy (2Timothy 1:8). This is no idle exhortation to endurance. NO, it is an invitation to enter more deeply into the Christian vocation which belongs to us all by baptism.

One hundred and thirty years ago, president Abraham Lincoln asked whether a nation "conceived in Liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal"

could "long endure". President Lincoln's question is no less a question for the present generation of Americans. Democracy cannot be sustained without a shared commitment to certain moral truths about human person and human community. The basic question before a democratic society is: "how ought we to live together?" In seeking an answer to this question, can society exclude moral truth and moral reasoning? Can the Biblical wisdom which played such a formative part in the very founding of this country be excluded from that debate?

May we as Catholics, be always guided by the truth about God who created and redeemed us, and by the truth about the human person, made in the image and likeness of God and destined for a glorious fulfilment in the kingdom to come. Always be convincing witnesses to the truth. Stir into flame the gift of God.
